



New Breast Prosthesis for Breast Cancer Survivors

Marietta, GA – With the help of a 25 year breast cancer survivor, Ellen Tassone, and American Breast Care’s Designer, Leslie Amick, ABC designed and developed The Massage Form, a breast prosthesis for women who have had a mastectomy. After testing the breast form and armed with insight not only as a breast cancer survivor but as a store owner of a mastectomy boutique, Tassone was pleased with the finished product. She says, “It’s as if I have my own breast back.”

The Massage Form was designed to be a lighter and cooler breast form. Created with lightweight silicone, it is 30% lighter than standard silicone. On the back of the breast prosthesis are “channels.” These channels were designed to accomplish two things for the wearer: to create a “massaging” action to the chest wall and to promote air circulation, making the breast form cooler.

A number of women have noted that this breast form is extremely comfortable and much cooler to wear. American Breast Care encourages women to experience the difference of The Massage Form for themselves. Ellen comments: “After having worn [breast] forms of all sizes, weights and shapes for 25 years, the new massage form has proven to be a winner for me. The form connects with my chest wall, and gently massages with each breath I take. It has a cooling effect and there is no shifting in the bra.”
